Roz Savage helps Nore Barn Woods project

Ocean-rower Roz Savage MBE has agreed to help spearhead the campaign to get the shore protection work completed along the shore of Nore Barn Woods.

Roz shot to fame in 2006 when she rowed single-handed across the Atlantic Ocean. Since then she has conquered the Pacific and Indian Oceans. Roz has connections with Emsworth. Not only has she lived here, but some work was completed on one of her vessels by an Emsworth boatyard. Over the years she has become a dedicated environmentalist. Among other work Roz is a board member of the Adventurers and Scientists for Conservation Organisation.

Roz will be meeting members of the Friends of Nore Barn Woods in May to talk about the project to complete the shore protection work there. She is also lending her support to the Grand Cream Tea being held in the woods on Sunday June 22 from 1pm to 5pm. The event is free and all are welcome. The Friends of Nore Barn say they hope the cream tea will mark the culmination of fundraising for the shore protection so that the work can be carried out before next Winter.
