



# Nore Barn Woods, a public open space, is on the shore of Chichester harbour, 1 mile west of Emsworth




#### The public woodland has a coastline of about 500m




#### Location



- 15 mins walk from central Emsworth
- Used by hundreds of people every week
- Rare to have a public open space so close to the water

## History

- Havant Council (HBC) owns the land
- Friends of Nore Barn Woods formed 2002
- Monthly work parties help manage the woods
- Previous project All ability path newly surfaced on northern boundary
- Increasing local concern about undercutting of southern shore

#### **FEBRUARY 2012**

The shore was badly undercut along the central section on the southern boundary of the woods



# Community involvement



 more than 90 households are Friends of Nore Barn Woods

 Between 10 and 30 turnout for monthly work parties

## Planning the shore project

- · Plans had been discussed with HBC for 3 years
- No money available from council/Environment Agency because no buildings or roads are under threat
- The Frends raised over £15,000 in time to start Phase
   1 in October 2012

### 2013 Phase 1 finished



The shingle layer over the earth bank helped, but the slope would need cladding in Armorloc blocks as a long term solution


## Fundraising for Phase 2

- Fundraising started early 2014 –

Work started: The earth slope was re-profiled and covered in shale, then a permeable membrane, then Armorloc blocks

### Interlocking Armorloc blocks go on top





### Phase 3 - 2015 onwards



Old Armorloc in the foreground runs out here – we need another 22m to complete the work.

### Phase 3

- Although we had a quote for Phase 3 in 2013 we could not raise all the money required to do Phases 2 and 3 together in 2014
- Fundraising for phase 3 started at the beginning of 2015
- It's a shorter stretch but will still cost a lot

### The future

- Active fundraising is ongoing
- December 2015 Tender likely to be issued
- Early 2016 we hope all funding will be in place and contractor appointed
- Work can only commence after over-wintering birds have departed
- We are very hopeful that Phase 3 can be completed during early 2016
