Cream Tea to be served at Nore Barn Woods on Sunday June 22 from 1pm to 5pm

Nore Barn Woods will be the backdrop to an outdoor cream tea taking place close to mid-summer's day on June 22nd from 1pm to 5pm. Scores of people are expected to come and have tea and cakes or scones as they enjoy the scenery. The woods are a 15-minute walk west from Emsworth along the shore, or can be approached from the sea end of Warblington Road.

Mike Thomas of the Friends of Nore Barn Woods says: 'We are hoping that visitors will get to know more about the woods and our shore conservation project while enjoying their outdoor tea in this attractive local beauty spot. All donations for tea and cakes will add to the funds for protecting the shore of the woods. After last year's ferocious storms the earth bank has been severely battered and if we hit our funding target we will be able to protect these popular woods with a more solid and lasting bank.'

Roz Savage, the famous ocean rower, is also lending her support to the Grand Cream Tea. She is a dedicated environmentalist and is helping to raise the profile of the project locally and further afield.

The event is free and all are welcome. The Friends of Nore Barn say they very much hope that the cream tea will mark the culmination of fundraising for the shore protection so that the work can be carried out before next Winter.
